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Public Hearing

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| 2011 Preliminary Budget Hearing | 9. | Mayor Johnson announced that a public hearing is scheduled on the 2011 preliminary budget. Finance Director Mulholland presented an overview of the 2011 budget, 2011 General Fund Revenues, and 2011 |
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General Fund Expenditures.

City Supervisor Sherman presented the budgets for Finance/Administration, Legislative, Mayor, City Supervisor, City Attorney, Human Resources, General Government, Capital Improvement Program, Airport, and Salary Schedule. He went through the Capital Improvement Program projects. He also discussed the Airport budget stating that the Airport will receive over \$4,000,000 in federal grants. He thanked the Mayor, Council, and department heads for all their work on the budget.

Mayor Johnson stated that Airport Manager Robb Parish will be retiring June 30, 2011. He stated the reason the Airport receives so many grants is because of the cooperation between Mr. Parish and the FAA. He thanked Robb Parish for his work.

Temporary Library Services Manager Bailey presented the Library request. She went through reductions that are planned and stated that the overall budget has been reduced.

Police Chief Jenkins presented Law Enforcement, Communications, and Animal Control budgets. Councilmember Bloom asked why there is an increase in cost for ammunition. He asked if they are using more ammunition or has the cost gone up. Police Chief Jenkins stated it is because the cost of ammunition has gone up.

Fire Operations Officer Mike Heston presented the budgets for Fire Control, Ambulance and Emergency Aid. Councilmember Benjamin asked if write-offs for the ambulance are down. Fire Operations Officer Mike Heston stated that they are receiving more money for ambulance calls. He also stated they are working real hard to keep the write-offs down. Finance Director Mulholland agreed they are working hard to reduce writeoffs.

Public Works Director Workman presented the budgets for Engineering, Inspections, Arterial Streets, Street Fund, Downtown Riverwalk, Water, Sewer, Utility Capital Projects, Transit, Equipment Rental, Government Buildings, 2007 Bond Fund, 2009 Water/Sewer Revenue Bond Fund, and Stormwater.

Councilmember Waldrop asked why the increase in Stormwater ERD rates and what does FTE stand for. Public Works Director Workman stated that the ERD increase is mainly for a vac truck which used to be charged to Streets. He explained that the rest of the increase is for other services such as stream cleanup, studies, permit fees, travel, communications and maintenance. He also explained that FTE stands for full-time equivalent and is the percentage of time an employee works in a budget.

Councilmember Bloom stated that if the Stormwater budget is increased, why is the Street Fund not seeing an decrease in costs. Public Works Director Workman stated that the Street Department budget has not decreased because it makes a payment to the Stormwater Utility reflecting street sweeper and other services it provided prior to creation of the Stormwater Utility.

Planning Director Dickinson presented the Planning Department budget.

Recreation Superintendent Dahmen presented the budgets for Public Services, Recreation Services, and the Aquatic Center.

Councilmember Benjamin asked if there would be any change of hours due to the budget. Recreation Superintendent Dahmen explained some changes to the schedule at the Aquatic Center.

Parks Superintendent Davis presented the budgets for Parks, Street Trees, Water Towers, Community Improvement, Cemetery, Cemetery Expansion, and Lawson Gardens.

Councilmember Waldrop asked if the cemetery was self-sustaining. Parks Superintendent Davis stated that the cemetery is not self-sustaining, but it is getting better.

Finance Director Mulholland presented budgets for the Civic Improvement Fund, LTGO Bond Fund, Information Systems, Cemetery Care Fund, and Firemen's Pension Fund.

Mayor Johnson stated that the General Fund is the most impacted by the budget. City Supervisor Sherman stated that the Economic & Revenue Forecast Council for the State of Washington has advised that layoffs in the public sector are affecting the private sector. The City will have to start making capital investments sometime soon. He thanked everyone for their help with the budget.

Mayor Johnson opened the public hearing. There was no one from the audience wishing to speak. Mayor Johnson closed the public hearing.

Ordinance

Ordinance No
10-23 - Retail
Sales Tax

10. Mayor Johnson announced that an ordinance had been prepared designing a fund to receive a percentage of Retail Sales Tax to be used for capital improvement purposes. Finance Director Mulholland presented the staff report. Councilmember Waldrop thanked everyone for the support of this concept. He stated this ordinance will not generate funds for three or four years. He also stated he does not see the need for quarterly reviews of the ordinance.

Councilmember Waldrop moved to remove the last whereas and take out the language for quarterly reviews. Councilmember Benjamin seconded the motion. Councilmember Paul stated he agreed with removing the quarterly reviews. City Supervisor Sherman stated when our economy gets better the Council can always review the ordinance. Councilmember Bloom asked if the last two whereas should not be removed. Councilmember Waldrop stated he felt the last whereas should stay in the ordinance. The motion to amend Ordinance No. 10-23 carried unanimously.

Ordinance No. 10-23 as amended reads as follows:

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING THE FUND TO RECEIVE A PERCENTAGE OF RETAIL SALES TAX REVENUE TO BE USED FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PURPOSES, ESTABLISHING

THAT PERCENTAGE, AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATED THERETO.

Councilmember Waldrop moved, Councilmember Benjamin seconded to adopt Ordinance No. 10-23. The motion carried unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Johnson asked if there was any new business from either the Council or audience. Councilmember Waldrop stated there was an excellent editorial in the Gazette about the state budget.

Councilmember Bloom stated that there had been a news article about five children killed in Florida due to a space heater. He asked about the possibility of having the Fire Department do a report on space heaters. Mayor Johnson stated that we have had fires in Pullman due to space heaters. Fire Operations Officer Heston stated that they could have Fire Prevention Officer Rich Dragoo speak on this issue at a future meeting.

Councilmember Paul stated he had seen one of the new buses and they are nice. He asked about the possibility of giving the old buses to a charitable organization.

Mayor Johnson stated that Senator Patti Murray and her office worked real hard to get us these new buses.

Mayor Johnson reminded everyone that the next Council meeting was a special meeting on Monday, November 15.

ADJOURNMENT

Councilmember Bloom moved, Councilmember Waldrop seconded to adjourn the regular meeting of the City Council.
