The Friends of Neill Public Library is a non-profit organization whose mission is to advocate for support and improvement of services and collections of Neill Public Library (NPL).

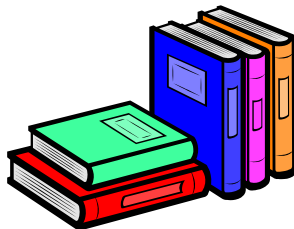
The Friends recruit members and encourage gifts and bequests administering them in accordance with the mission and policies of the NPL Board of Trustees.

Friends funds provided to NPL are intended to supplement the Library's general budget provided by the City of Pullman and not replace it.

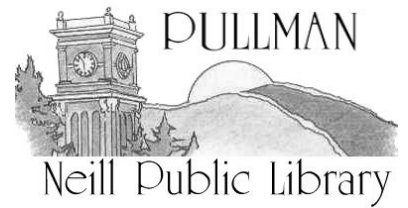
The Friends of Neill Public Library is a 501-(c)3 organization.

FREE LIBRARY CARD

Present your library card for assistance at Circulation. Please report lost or stolen cards and change of name, street, e-mail address or phone number.

To insure the right to privacy, every patron is asked to have his / her own card. Temporary cards are available.

PATRON PRIVILEGES & RESPONSIBILITIES

Patrons who have a valid library card have free access to collections and information sources. Patrons are responsible for their choices of materials, as well as for information accessed on the Internet. There are no age limits on any collection.

Parents are responsible for what their children up to the age of 18 are borrowing or accessing in the library, including use of the Internet.

Children ages 7 or under must be accompanied in the library by a parent/guardian.

LOAN PERIODS

All materials may be checked out for 3 weeks.

FINES & CHARGES

There is a one-day grace period for due dates. Fines accrue at .25 per day per item to a maximum of \$6 per item per checkout. Borrowing privileges are suspended if \$25 or more is owed. Accounts owing \$100 or more will be referred to a collection agency, if restitution is not made in a timely manner.

LOST MATERIAL

- Charges are assessed at full replacement cost or at partial fee as determined by a librarian.
- Within 30 days of payment, found items are eligible for a partial refund if material is returned in an acceptable condition (per librarian assessment and unless item has been removed from catalog).

DAMAGED MATERIAL

- Charges are assessed at full or partial replacement cost as determined by a librarian.
- Replacements for damaged and /or lost materials may be accepted at the discretion of the Collection Librarian.
